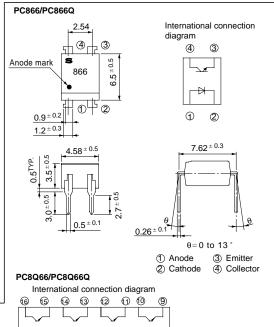

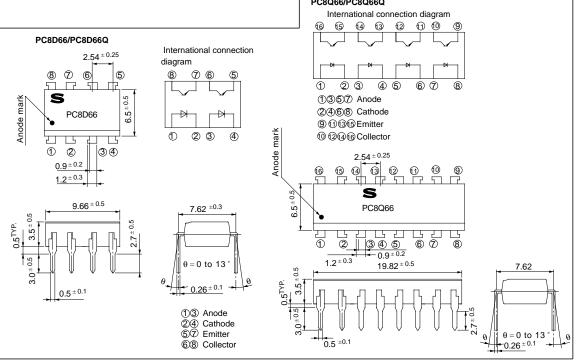

Ambient Temperature

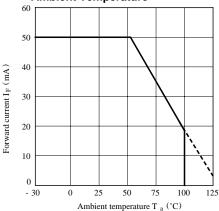


Fig. 3 Collector Power Dissipation vs.
Ambient Temperature

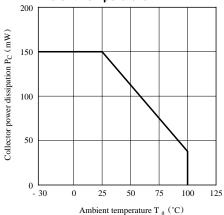


Fig. 5 Peak Forward Current vs. Duty Ratio

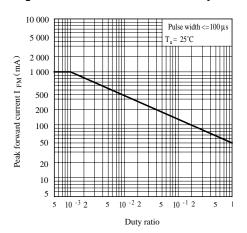


Fig. 2 Diode Power Dissipation vs.
Ambient Temperature

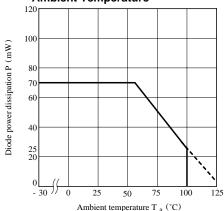


Fig. 4 Power Dissipation vs.
Ambient Temperature

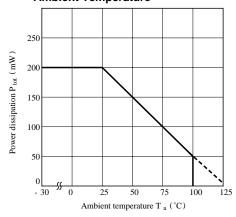


Fig. 6 Forward Current vs. Forward Voltage

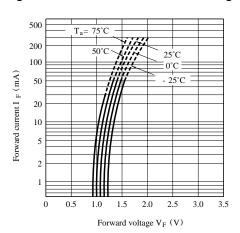


Fig. 7 Current Transfer Ratio vs. Forward Current

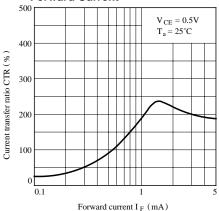


Fig. 9 Relative Current Transfer Ratio vs.
Ambient Temperature

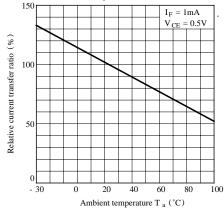


Fig.11 Collector Dark Current vs.
Ambient Temperature

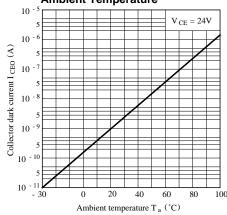


Fig. 8 Collector Current vs.
Collector-emitter Voltage

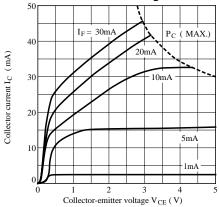


Fig.10 Collector-emitter Saturation Voltage vs. Ambient Temperature

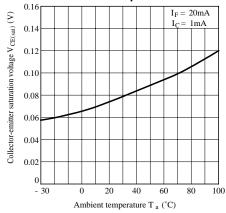
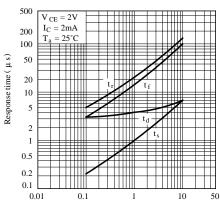


Fig.12 Response Time vs. Load Resistance

Fig.13 Frequency Response

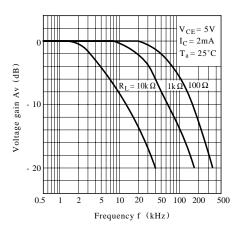
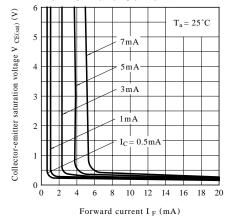
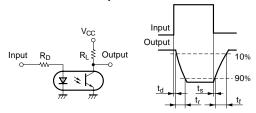


Fig.14 Collector-emitter Saturation Voltage vs. Forward Current

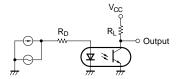
